



Preserve Craig ~ Sustaining the Quality of Life We Value

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Report to the Craig County Board of Supervisors January 7, 2016

Summary of Mountain Valley Pipeline (MVP), Atlantic Coast Pipeline (ACP) and Craig County Events and Activities since the 12/3/2015 Board Meeting

- 1. On December 24, 2015 Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) asked MVP to answer 51 pages of questions and requests for additional information needed before setting a schedule for preparing the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).**
- 2. FERC is seeking comments on revised EIS procedures by January 19.**
- 3. FERC rejects requests for a Programmatic Environmental Impact Study (PEIS).**
- 4. FERC asks Atlantic Coast Pipeline (ACP) to consider combining MVP or southern route.**
- 5. EQT Midstream announces plan to invest \$600+ million dollars on MVP in 2016.**
- 6. MVP is withholding full GIS Shape files on the entire route, making it difficult to evaluate the accuracy of the MVP application and resource reports.**
- 7. MVP is trying to buy property in Elliston for an undisclosed 4th compressor station.**
- 8. Preserve Craig filed as an intervenor with FERC on Nov. 25, 2015.**
- 9. Preserve Craig continues to work closely with attorneys on effective strategies to oppose the Mountain Valley Pipeline.**
- 10. Preserve Craig is continuing to work with legislators to investigate the FERC.**
- 11. Preserve Craig continues to push for a Programmatic Environmental Impact Study, along with other preserve groups and environmental watchdog agencies.**
- 12. 10 months work to date – over 1400 pages submitted on behalf of community to defend Craig County. Over 15,000 volunteer hours valued over \$360,000.**
- 13. Preserve Craig continues to participate in Regional Meetings with other counties in Virginia and West Virginia.**
